


Welcome to the EndoStand Tool



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EndoStand helps women living with endometriosis understand their medical reports by translating complex medical language into clear, accessible explanations.

How to use the tool:

Simplified Report Beta Version

What was analyzed and why?

We did a transvaginal ultrasound (a type of scan where a small device is inserted into the vagina to take images of the pelvic organs) to understand why a woman has severe menstrual pain, pelvic pain that spreads to her lower back, and increased menstrual flow over the past four years. Previous treatments with birth control pills and painkillers have not helped much.

What are the results, and what do they indicate?

The scan showed a 4.2 cm endometrioma (a type of cyst formed from endometrial tissue, which is the tissue that lines the inside of the uterus) in the left ovary. The uterus is tilted forward and slightly enlarged, with thickening in the back wall, which suggests adenomyosis (when the tissue that lines the inside of the uterus grows into its wall). There is some fluid in the pouch of Douglas (a small space behind the uterus). There are no cysts or masses in the

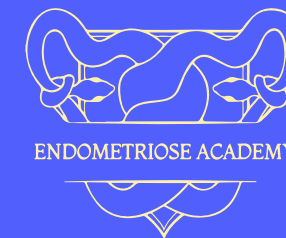
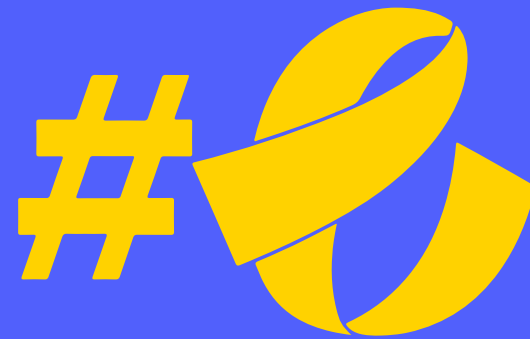

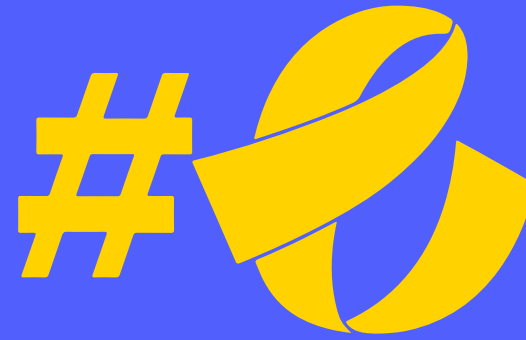
